"What's the Point: Understanding the Message, Speaker Intent, and Making Appropriate Semantic Sign Choices"

This training will guide participants through a series of steps that will result in a deeper understanding of the speaker's intent. The goal is to help interpreters change their approach to the interpreting process, which will result in interpretations that more clearly convey the speaker's implied intent. When we understand the speaker's intentions we can then ensure that sign selections are semantically appropriate.

"Incorporating Non-Manual Markers/Signals: Broaden your Understanding and Ability to Incorporate Non –Manual Markers Including Adverbs and Adjectives"

This workshop has a focus on non-manual signals, which are not distinctive "hand signs" yet are essential language morphemes. Interpreters will analyze and apply these grammatical markers, which involve eye and head movements, facial movements, and body postures rather than the use of "signs" as distinct lexical elements. "Professional Development Planning: Deliberate Practice is Necessary to Improve EIPA Scores"


