Let Me T/RI and Explain: ASL/Spanish/English

Intended for Bilinguals, Trilingual Interpreters Provided

Gain a better understanding of the process for trilingual colleagues, potential strategies for supporting a trilingual team, and how bilingual interpreters are gatekeepers of access.



Orlando Obeso Gomez is a nationally certified sign language interpreter working as a trilingual (Spanish/ASL/English) staff interpreter at the New Mexico School for the Deaf in Santa Fe, NM. Orlando is first-generation American and proud son of Mexican immigrants. This rich heritage, as well as the diverse culture of New Mexico, has contributed to his development as a trilingual interpreter. Orlando graduated from the University of New Mexico with a double major in Linguistics and Sign Language Interpreting and completed his graduate studies in Spanish-English Interpretation and Translation at the Universidad Autonoma de Guadalajara, in Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico in 2020. Last year he was awarded the BEI Trilingual Advanced certification, the only trilingual certification in the country held by fewer than twenty interpreters nationwide. His work experience includes educational, post-secondary, community, VRS, and international/multilingual settings. He has extensive experience with mentoring novice and experienced interpreters as well as working with students of the profession. Equipped with a love for language, he is eager to share his passion for trilingual interpreting with other professionals.
