Ms. Frazier has over 17 years of professional interpreting experience in a variety of settings. She has held the National Interpreter Certification (NIC) from the Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (RID) since 2008.

Ms. Frazier currently works as a freelance interpreter in the Washington, DC metropolitan area. Throughout her career, she has, not only continuously sought professional development opportunities, but has also looked for opportunities to give back to the profession. She served a two-year term on the board of the Potomac Chapter of the Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (PCRID) as Member at Large for Maryland. Ms. Frazier is a Mentor and adjunct instructor for the Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC) Interpreter Preparation Program, her alma mater. She has taught a variety of courses and workshops in the interpreting field.

In addition to teaching, mentoring, and interpreting, since 2016, she also works as an Assistant Director for Administration for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Ms. Frazier was led to this career path while working as an interpreter and EEO Specialist for her current Federal agency. She graduated in 2005 from CCBC with an AAS in Interpreter Preparation and BS in Deaf Studies concurrently.

This propelled him to leave the Federal government in February 2019 to pursue interpreting, creating Intentional Interpreting, LLC TFITHP. Antonio is newly certified (December 2021) but well-versed in Black male life experience.
